Governor takes stock of activities of Welfare of Bodoland Department and Hill Areas Development department KAAC and NCHAC

Guwahati, December 5: Assam Governor Shri Gulab Chand Kataria took a comprehensive briefing on the activities of the Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) in the presence of the Hills Areas Department Minister Jogen Mohan. The Addl Chief Secretary HAD Biswaranjan Samal and the Principal Secretary KAAC Mukul Kumar Saikia gave an overview of various departmental endeavors, including Health and Family Welfare, PWD, and the Agriculture Department.
