Governor takes stock of activities of Tribal Affairs (Plain) Department

Guwahati, December 6: Assam Governor Shri Gulab Chand Kataria today took stock of the implementation of various central and state-sponsored schemes of the Department of Tribal Affairs (Plain) at a meeting held at Raj Bhavan.

Regarding infrastructure development in Integrated Tribal Development Projects (ITDP) in the tribal dominated areas, the Governor stressed on the importance of not only ensuring the quality of infrastructure but also periodically monitoring the living conditions in the areas.
