Governor takes stock of the development works of Kamrup Metropolitan District

Guwahati, January 8: Assam Governor Shri Gulab Chand Kataria chaired a meeting with the heads of the departments and took stock of the development works along with prevailing law and order of Kamrup Metropolitan District at the conference hall of District Commissioner's office today.
