Speaking on the occasion, Governor Shri Acharya said, "Busu Dima Festival is not just an agricultural celebration, it is a symbol of our culture, traditions, and social unity. This festival gives us an opportunity to reaffirm the cardinal values of cooperation, hard work, and unity taught by our ancestors". He said, "Ours is an agrarian society where the main vocations of the people are associated with agriculture. Agriculture is not merely a means of livelihood; it is a foundation of our heritage. From sowing seeds to harvesting crops, each process has given birth to unique customs and festivals. One such festival is the Busu Dima Festival, which eulogize our intrinsic bond with the agriculture". He also hailed the Dimasa society for celebrating the Busu Dima festival which according to the Governor will give a thrust to agricultural practices.
