Guwahati, August 19: Assam Governor Gulab Chand Kataria said that engineers play a vital role in developing sustainable solutions, innovative technologies, and designing resilient infrastructure to combat the impact of climate change.

Climate change alters many of earth's natural processes and causes widespread issues such as rising sea levels, melting ice caps, extreme weather conditions, and increased pollution. These phenomena have a significant impact on humans because they can lead to displacement of human settlement, food insecurity, increased risk of respiratory illnesses so on and so forth.

The Governor however, said that the effects of climate change can be reduced by being less dependent on fossil fuels. He said that increasing use of renewable energy sources like solar, wind, geothermal hydropower etc should be promoted.
