Governor launches two new schemes The initiatives will strengthen the spirit of "Nation First":Governor

Guwahati, February 23: Assam Governor Shri Lakshman Prasad Acharya, today launched two new schemes namely Governor Assam Rashtriya Suraksha Protsahan Sankalp and Governor Assam Rashtriya Sewa Protsahan Sankalp at Raj Bhavan today.

It may be mentioned that Assam Governor's Rashtriya Suraksha Protsahan Sankalp is an initiative proposed and envisaged by Raj Bhavan, Assam, in partnership with the National Cadet Corps (NCC), Assam. Shri Acharya also said that National development is not only the responsibility of the army and police but also requires the active participation of every citizen, especially the youth. With this objective in mind, the Raj Bhavan, Assam, conceptualized the schemes enabling the youth to contribute effectively to national prosperity.
