

Governor meets Registrars of Universities

Takes stock of implementation of NEP 2020

Guwahati, May 26: The two day meeting of the registrars convened at Raj Bhavan to discuss important academic and administrative issues of the universities ended today.

Assam Governor Gulab Chand Kataria convened the meeting with the registrars of the Central and State government universities to take stock of the state of academic and administrative affairs prevailing in both the Central and State universities. As a part of the meeting, the representatives of the universities either registrar or any senior professor on behalf of the university presented their academic programmes and the future plan of action.

Representatives from 18 universities had presented their comprehensive action plan along with the steps to roll out the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

The Governor said that in view of implementing the provisions of NEP 2020, the universities need to ramp up their academic and administrative mechanisms to help the students cope with the changing dynamics of education.
