## Governor holds meeting with district administration of Bongaigaon

**Guwahati, July 26:** Assam Governor Shri Gulab Chand Kataria held a review meeting with the district administration of Bongaigaon to assess the progress of various Central and State government schemes in the district at DC's conference hall in Bongaigaon today.
