

Assam Governor attends youth conclave

Calls upon the youth to upscale their skills and prepare themselves for 'Industry 4.0'

Guwahati, September 9: Assam Governor Gulab Chand Kataria attended a youth conclave 2.0 on the theme 'Skilling Youths on Atma Nirbhar Bharat' which was jointly organised by Mayang Anchalik College in collaboration with Assam Skill Development Mission NESC, Council for Teacher Education Foundation-Assam and Gauhati University NSS cell at Mayong Anchalik College, in Morigaon today.
