## Speech of the Honourable Governor of Assam and Hon'ble Chancellor Dibrugarh University Professor Jagdish Mukhi

Respected His Excellency the Vice President of India and the Chief Guest of the XVIII Convocation of Dibrugarh University Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu Ji, Chief Minister of Assam and the distinguished Guest of Honour Shri Sarbananda Sonowal Ji, the Vice-Chancellor Dibrugarh University Prof. Ranjit Tamuli ji, honourable guests, Deans, faculty and staff of the University, parents, graduating students, alumni, ladies and gentlemen. It gives me immense pleasure to preside over the Eighteenth Convocation of Dibrugarh University today.

Dibrugarh University has completed fifty-three glorious years of imparting knowledge and conducting research of the highest standard in the North-east of India. Since 1965, Dibrugarh University, the second-oldest state university and the easternmost, has been relentlessly striving to achieve academic excellence and dissemination of knowledge in all fields of study. Situated in a region of immense ecological and ethno-cultural diversity, Dibrugarh University is blessed with the potential of creating excellent human resources to harness

the natural resources of the region as well as conducting inquiries into the manifold values of traditional and indigenous knowledge of the area.

So far as the geostrategic location of Dibrugarh university in terms of its international borders and relationship with the neighbouring countries like China, Myanmar, Bangladesh, and Bhutan, it can play a very instrumental role. The agenda of the Government of India on *Act East Policy* has to be translated into reality, and our Universities have to play a vital role in this regard.

Our education must create confidence among the students to take pride in the rich heritage of our civilization. Respect for local languages and their promotion should be yet another aspect of University teachings as the extinction of languages implies extinction of life experiences and learning which are codified through languages. Here I appreciate the decision of Dibrugarh University to open courses on Bodo, Mising, Deuri and Karbi languages.

The University must think in a different way to address the contemporary issues of the society effectively. Merely teaching without innovation in programme objectives and pedagogy will unnecessarily produce more unemployed youth who become national liability instead of being national asset. New thought, new endeavour and innovation in academic exercise can only erase this unfortunate gloomy situation. The recognition of NAAC with 'A' grade to Dibrugarh University should be utilized properly for both academic-intellectual and infra-structural growth and expansion.

Lastly, wishing the very best to the students, let me call upon all the graduates continue your quest to acquire knowledge throughout your lives and utilize the knowledge to educate your fellow human beings.
